

walls that may reecho praise.


Living stones, by God appointed

to an old and weary earth.


Tell the praise of him who called you

and so prepare ourselves to celebrate the sacred mysteries.





and soon the night of weeping shall be the morn of song.


Mid toil and tribulation, and tumult of her war,

like them, the meek and lowly, may dwell on high with thee.


Pray, my brothers and sisters,

we dare to say:


**O**ur Father, Who art in heaven


**For the kingdom, the power
