we dare to say:

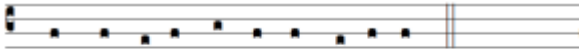
Our Father, Who art in heaven

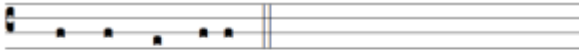
**For the kingdom, the power

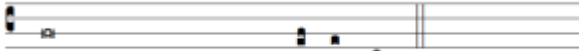

O for grace to love thee more!


