



And make Your broken people whole



we dare to say:

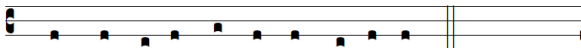
Our Father, Who art in heaven

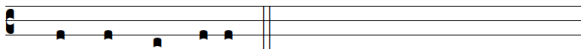
**For the kingdom, the power
