At the Saviour's command and formed by divine teaching, we dare to say:

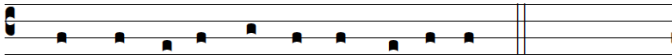
Our Father, Who art in heaven

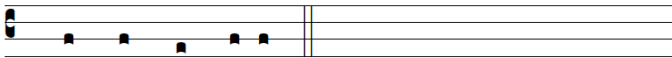
**For the Kingdom, the power

With thine own self in form of bread.

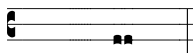


