For mortals and for sinners, a mansion with the blest.

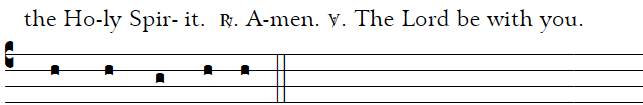
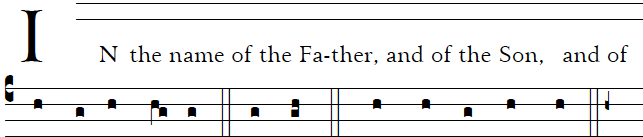
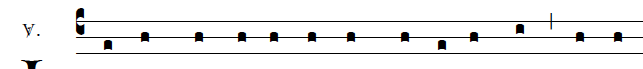

but deliver us from evil.

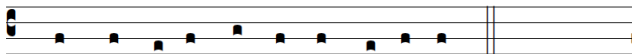
