## PRAYER BEFORE A CRUCIFIX



Behold, O kind and most sweet Jesus,  
I cast myself upon my knees in Thy sight,

my Jesus: "They have pierced My hands and My feet;  
they have numbered all My bones."

## SOLEMN CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S PASSION

*The priest and sacred ministers enter in silence and go to the altar. They make a reverence and prostrate themselves, all kneel. All pray silently for a while.*

PRAYER

**R**emember your mercies, O Lord,  
and with your eternal protection sanctify your servants,  
for whom Christ your Son,  
by the shedding of his Blood,  
established the Paschal Mystery.  
Who lives and reigns for ever and ever. **Amen.**





*Ps.* May God have mer-cy on us and bless us; \* may he let  
his face shed its light up-on us and have mer- cy on us.

*And the antiphon is repeated : We adore your Cross.*

*After the altar party have venerated the Cross all may come and venerate. Come and venerate from all sides, there is no need to queue. It is Traditional to genuflect or bow profoundly before you approach the Cross.*



## PART 3 – HOLY COMMUNION

THE LORD'S PRAYER

**STAND**

At the Saviour's command and formed by divine teaching, we dare to say:

**O**ur Father, Who art in heaven  
Hallowed be Thy Name;  
Thy kingdom come,  
Thy will be done,  
on earth as it is in heaven.  
Give us this day our daily bread,  
and forgive us our trespasses,  
as we forgive those who trespass against us;  
and lead us not into temptation,  
but deliver us from evil.

Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil, graciously grant peace in our days,  
that, by the help of your mercy, we may be always free from sin and safe from  
all distress, as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Saviour Jesus  
Christ.

**For the Kingdom, the power  
and the glory are yours  
Now and for ever.**

Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sin of the world.  
Blessed are those who are called to the supper of the lamb.

**Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but  
only say the word and my soul shall be healed.**

DURING HOLY COMMUNION

When I survey the wondrous cross  
On which the Prince of glory died,  
My richest gain I count but loss,  
And pour contempt on all my pride.

We ask this through Christ our Lord.  
**Amen.**

PRAYER OVER THE PEOPLE

Lord, Send down your abundant blessing  
Upon your people who have devoutly recalled the death  
Of your Son in the sure hope of the resurrection.  
Grant them pardon; bring them comfort.  
May their faith grow stronger  
And their eternal salvation be assured.  
We ask this through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

*All depart in SILENCE. It is customary to Genuflect to the cross on this day.*
