## ENTRANCE HYMN


Come, ye thankful people, come,

wholesome grain and pure may be.


4 Even so, Lord, quickly come,

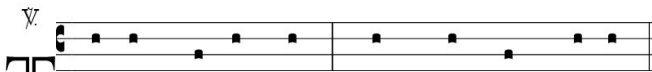

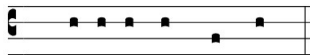

This our hymn of grateful praise.




Pray, my brothers and sisters,

for our good, and the good of all his holy Church.**





We all **KNEEL** as the Celebrant continues with the Eucharistic Prayer.

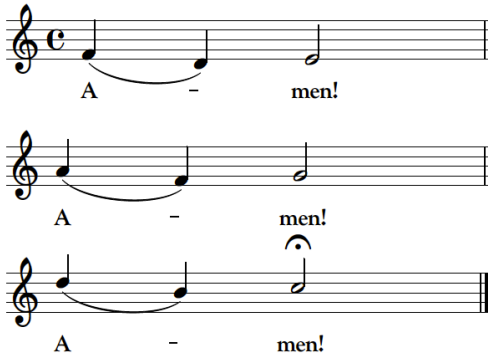
After the Lord's words are said over the bread and the chalice

but deliver us from evil.**

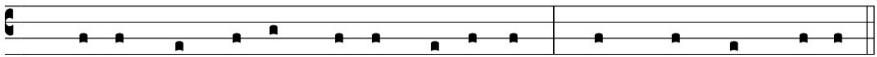
Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil,

 now and for ever.

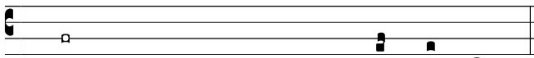
Lord Jesus Christ, who said to your Apostles:


