and to bring forth the fruit of the Spirit.



of our solemn litany.

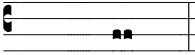

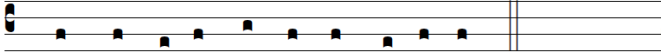
At the Saviour's command and formed by divine teaching, we dare to say:

but deliver us from evil.**

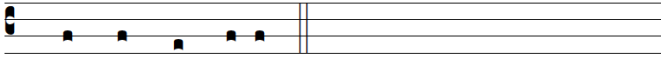
