## THE RITE OF CONFIRMATION

Right Reverend Father in God, We present *NANCY & DENIM* for the sacrament of confirmation.

We judge them to be sincere in their desire. They have heard the word of Christ in the assembly of the Church and have attempted to shape their conduct accordingly. They have shared in the fellowship and prayer of their brothers and sisters. Now I wish to inform you and all here present of our decision thus to call them.

*The bishop asks the candidates;*

Have you been baptized in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit?

*Candidates.*      **I have.**

### *RENEWAL OF BAPTISMAL PROMISES*

*After the Homily the candidates stand before the Bishop and he questions them:*

Bishop            Do you renounce Satan, and all his works and empty promises?

*Candidates*      **I do.**

Bishop            Do you believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth?

*Candidates*      **I do.**

Bishop:            Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was born of the Virgin Mary, suffered death and was buried, rose again from the dead and is seated at the right hand of the Father?

*Candidates*      **I do.**

Bishop: Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who today through the Sacrament of Confirmation is given to you in a special way just as he was given to the Apostles on the day of Pentecost?

*Candidates* **I do.**

Bishop: Do you believe in the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting?

*Candidates* **I do.**

*The Bishop gives his assent to the profession by proclaiming the faith of the Church:*

Bishop This is our faith. This is the faith of the Church. We are proud to profess it in Christ Jesus our Lord.

*The gathering of the faithful gives its assent by replying:*

*All:* **Amen.**

*Then the Bishop standing, facing the people, with hands joined, says:*

Dearly beloved, let us pray to God the almighty Father ,for these, his adopted sons and daughters, already born again to eternal life in Baptism, that he will graciously pour out the Holy Spirit upon them to confirm them with his abundant gifts, and through his anointing conform them more fully to Christ, the Son of God.

*And all pray in silence for a while.*

*Then the Bishop extends his hands toward the candidates to be confirmed.*

Almighty God, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who brought these your servants to new birth by water and the Holy Spirit, freeing them from sin: send upon them, O Lord, the Holy Spirit, the Paraclete; give them the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and fortitude, the spirit of knowledge and piety; fill them with the spirit of the fear of the Lord. Through Christ our Lord.

*All:* **Amen.**

*The candidates come to the Bishop one by one, led by their sponsors and kneel before him.*

Bishop. **N.** God has called you by name and made you his own.

*He then lays his hand of the head of each saying:*

Confirm, O Lord, your servant with your Holy Spirit.

*The Bishop dips the tip of the thumb of his right hand in the Chrism and, with the thumb, makes the Sign of the Cross on the forehead of the one to be confirmed, as he says:*

Bishop            N., be sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit.

Candidate        **Amen.**

Bishop            Peace be with you.

Candidate        **And with your spirit.**


