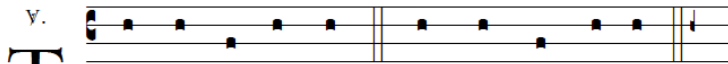
*After the address, the Priest says the following prayer with hands extended.*

Let us pray.

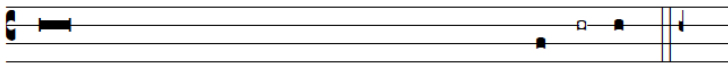




THE PROFESSION OF FAITH


I believe in one God,

weak in giving power to be.


