Coronavirus presents a serious risk to the most vulnerable in our community and, as a Church community that follows Jesus' Commands to Love God and to Love our Neighbours, we must make sure that we do our best to look after our most vulnerable neighbours even though this will mean that we have to change those things that we feel comfortable with. The actions that we are putting in place follow the advice and instructions that we have received from the Church of England and our Archbishops. We will review them daily to make sure that we are doing our best to minimise the risk of passing this virus to others.

Our first defence against Coronavirus is to maintain good personal hygiene. This includes washing hands frequently, and after incidents which present an increased chance of infection.

HAND SANITIZER IS PROVIDED AT THE DOOR, PLEASE USE IT!

If you cough or sneeze you should follow the NHS advice (which has been given for many years:

- CATCH IT use a tissue to catch a cough or sneeze
- BIN IT throw that tissue in the bin
- KILL IT wash your hands quickly

Anyone that feels unwell should stay at home and rest.

All Saints has implemented these changes to the way we celebrate Mass to comply with the advice and instruction that we have received.

LENTEN PRAYER OF S EPHREM THE SYRIAN

To be used daily during lent

O Lord and Master of my life!
Take from me the spirit of sloth,
faint-heartedness,
lust of power, and idle talk.
But give rather
the spirit of chastity,
humility, patience,
and love to Thy servant.
Yea, Lord and King!
Grant me to see my own errors
and not to judge my brother,
for Thou art blessed
unto ages of ages. Amen.

1. We will avoid physical contact whilst sharing the peace. This includes shaking hands and fist bumps! We will say “The peace of the Lord be with you always - and with your spirit” - and turn and make a bow to the person next to you. You may wish to consider sitting less closely together too.

2. Anyone that is involved in the preparing of the altar will either wash their hands or use hand sanitiser immediately before they do so this this includes servers as well as the priest.

3. We will not process with the gifts of bread and wine they will be already on the credence table at the front. This is to minimise the number of people that come into contact with them.

4. A collection plate/bag will not be passed around. A basket will be provided at the back of Church.

5. Communion will only be distributed in one kind whilst the chalice will be used to consecrate the blood of christ, it's contents will only be consumed by the priest.

6. The Host will only be placed on the hand not on the tongue. Holy Communion will be given standing, not at the rail.

7. The priest will not touch a person that has come forward for an individual blessing. He will make the sign of the cross in front of them and pray for God's blessing to be on them.

8. We will be maintaining strict hygiene of the public areas, such as the Lavatories and the door handles.

8. We may have to consider stopping refreshments after Mass, we will look at this as and when things progress.

In all things that we do, we do them for Our Lord Jesus Christ. It is important that we do not loose focus on this. Please keep praying for those that are suffering because of Coronavirus, those that are helping them and those that are trying to keep us all safe.

Keep us, good Lord,
under the shadow
of your mercy
in this time of uncertainty
and distress.
Sustain and support the
anxious and fearful,
and lift up all
who are brought low;
that we may rejoice
in your comfort
knowing that nothing can
separate us from your love
in Christ Jesus our Lord.
