

THE PROFESSION OF FAITH

As the altar is prepared, gifts of Bread and wine are presented and we sing:



At the Saviour's command and formed by divine teaching, we dare to say:


Our Father, Who art in heaven


All For the Kingdom, the power and the glory are yours,


